

FAMILY ADVOCATE Residential

GENERAL FUNCTIONS: Provide survivor centered, individualized and trauma-informed support, advocacy, and case management for victims of intimate partner abuse, with focus on delivery of services for victims and their children/families living in emergency shelter.

ESSENTIAL FUNCTIONS:

- 60% Provide individual and group support using multiple methods and modalities. Facilitate case management, crisis counseling, safety planning, legal advocacy and follow up services for victims of domestic violence. Support victims in identification of their unique healing and sufficiency goals, and deliver related services to help victims overcome barriers to these goals.
- 20% Participate in meetings and events related to agency, programming, case reviews, and community-based partnerships. Complete/maintain ODVN Certified Domestic Violence Advocate training, maintaining necessary continuing annual education to maintain certification throughout tenure in role.
- 15% Track and maintain regular statistical information in case notes in Osnium.
- 5% Other duties as assigned related to services for survivors of domestic violence.

MINIMUM REQUIREMENTS:

Education: Associate Degree in related field. Bachelor's Degree preferred in related field with working knowledge of program best practices.

Other: Fluency in languages other than English and cultural knowledge are a plus. Must have a valid driver's license as appropriate per job needs. Complete ODVN Family Advocate training and become registered advocate within first year of employment.
